grade side.

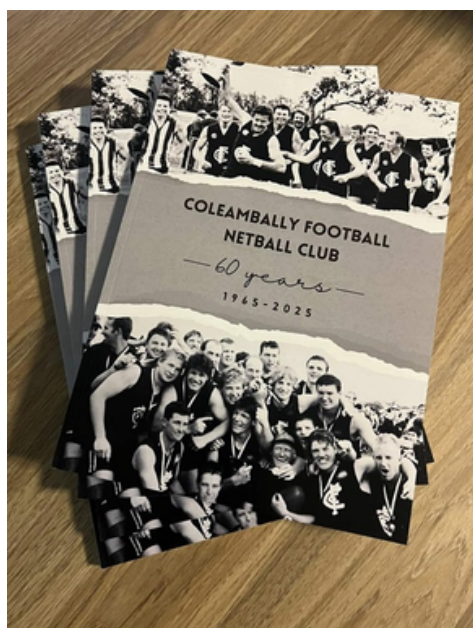


Coleambally Riverina Vintage Machinery Rally

engines .

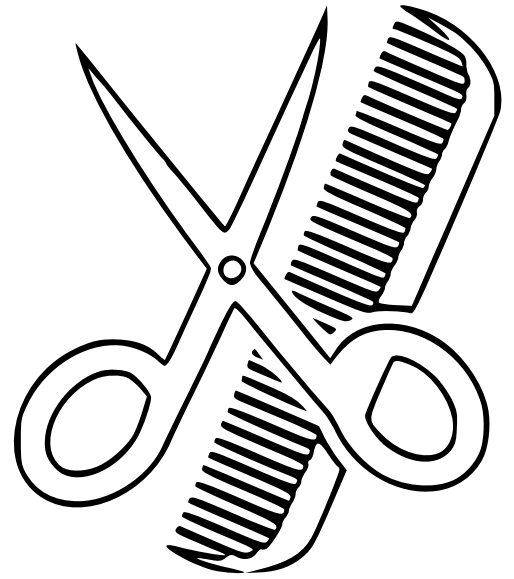

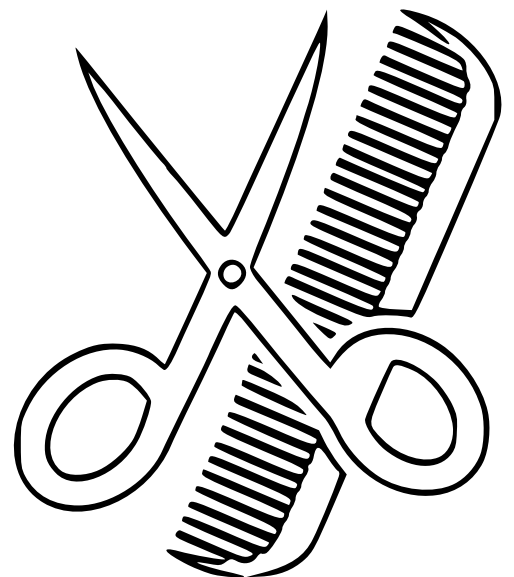




As we head into cooler weather, make sure to remember to rug up in warm clothes.
